



## Cazador-del-sol Lights the North at Summer Solstice

The Cazador continues its trip through the countries and cities of Europe and is now staying in the far north. Here in Rovaniemi (Finland), where the sun will not set for some time after June 21<sup>st</sup>, our Cazador-del-sol will give pleasure to the visitors of the "Arktikum". Our installation "66°" is part of the special exhibition "**Climate Change in Lapland's Nature – What Can We Do?**", which is organized by the department of Natural History of the The Provincial Museum of Lapland.

You might wonder who or what is "**Cazador-del-sol**"?

It is a Spanish term meaning "hunter of the sun". The suncatchers are made from a fluorescent plastic, which absorbs the sunlight and transforms it into a very warm light. René Hildebrand, who created this unique round Perspex disc more than 10 years ago, realizes fantastic installations all over Europe using these **Cazadores**. You can also order suncatchers in various sizes and colours as a shining accessory for your garden or your balcony via our online shop.

In Rovaniemi our Cazadores lighten up the rooms and visitors of the Arktikum in the glass corridor – the most visible part of the museum – which points north like a finger. In keeping with our tradition there is a special engraving on the suncatchers of this installation: "**66°**" as a synonym for the parallel where the installation is located – i.e. the polar circle. It also marks the area where the sun does not set during the days of summer solstice. It is a very special experience.
